

## Stripes Yipes!

During class, we'll make blocks of both above samples: hexagons and squares.
Multi-colored stripes width varying widths work best. Blocks made from each sample can be made into a baby-sized quilt. If you plan to make a larger size, more fabric will be required.

For each, you'll need $1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards striped fabric. Fabric to complete each baby sized quilt are below.

Hexagon Quilt (approximately 31" x 36"):
$1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards striped fabric
$3 / 4$ yard for setting triangles and borders (not suited for directional fabric)
$1 / 3$ yard binding fabric
$11 / 4$ yard backing fabric
Batting, at least $40^{\prime \prime} \times 44^{\prime \prime}$

Square Quilt (approximately 40" $\times 40$ "):
$1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards striped fabric
$1 / 2$ yard border fabric
$1 / 3$ yard binding fabric
$1 \frac{1}{4}$ yard backing fabric
Batting, at least 44" $\times 44^{\prime \prime}$

## Also needed:

Rotary cutter with new blade and cutting mat. Thread to match fabrics. 24 " long ruler and square 12 $1 / 2 "$ ruler or similar sizes. For the hexagon quilt, a 60 degree, $81 / 2 "$ ruler with blunted top point is required. Usual supplies such as marking tools, pins, seam ripper and anything else you can't live without!
