#### March Program—Paula Golden, "With a Judge's Eye"

#### April Program— Julia Graves, "Quilter, Longarmer, Teacher and Artist"



Julia Graves started her quilting business, Special Occasion Quilts LLC, in 2007 and teaches, lectures, designs patterns, makes commission quilts, longarms for others, sells & services APQS longarm machines and writes for the APQS Blog. She won Best Longarm Machine Workmanship Wall Quilt Category at the 2016 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival, has had quilts published in books by Gloria Loughman, Katie Pasquini-Masupust and MJ Kinman, was an Artist in Residence at Empty Spools in 2019, and is now a regular instructor at Empty Spools Seminars.

Julia has been sewing since she was ten and always loved fabric, needle arts and the entire creative process. She did her apprenticeship as a quilter by making a quilt for each of her nieces and nephews (and thinks she should have counted them before making this promise – there were 32!). She has since made more quilts than she can count, many for charity, and is partial to scrap quilts and working with color to achieve amazing results. Julia will demystify the process and give you guidelines to bring out the beauty of your quilt with lots of quilt examples."

**Once again** it is time to consider who will lead CPQG into the next year. The past two years have been challenging and wonderful. Your guild is strong and ready for the next adventure and will need new leadership in June.

Here is a summary of the different Board positions that are open for the 2025-2026 year. Please know that a more complete explanation of each office is in the Policy and Procedures and Bylaws on the Member's Only page on our website. People in the current positions will be happy to help with the transition to our new leaders.

The President sets the tone and energy for the guild. This is why her role is so important. She must be able to clearly conduct the business of our public monthly meetings as well as set the pace for the day. There are lots of background tasks relating to the meeting itself. This includes securing a meeting site, responsibility for the key and facilities, room set up and take down. She also sets the agenda, sets Board meetings, appoints committees as needed, oversees the storage facility, and stays in contact with her other board members.

The Vice President has four primary tasks. She fills in for the President as needed. Coordinates the challenge quilt effort for the MidAtlantic Quilt Festival. Reviews the quarterly bank statements supplied by the treasurer. And leads the nominating committee to fill vacant board and committee positions.

The Secretary records the proceedings at Board and monthly Guild meetings, is responsible for all correspondence, retrieves the mail from the post office and coordinates with the Treasurer and website manager. Use of a computer is important in this role.

























The Treasurer manages all the Guild money and keeps accurate records of expenditure and disbursements. She establishes and presents the budget both to the Board and at Guild meetings. Retrieves the mail. Being able to use Excel is helpful, but other programs can be used.

The Program is the heart of the monthly meeting. The Program Chair and her committee are critical to the success and fun of the Guild. By tradition there are monthly presenters and workshops every other month, but this is not mandated. Thinking outside the box is encouraged. It is their responsibility to plan programs for the calendar year within the allotted budget.

Program contracts must be presented to the board for approval and ensure that invoices are presented to the Treasurer. This committee also collects and tracks monies collected for program attendees, ensures there is a representative at the program table each Guild meeting and present for any workshop. Workshops may include set up and take-down and retrieval/return of supplies from the storage facility.

The Website Manger is to keep the Guild webpage current and make it the primary vehicle for communicating with Guild members along with our Facebook page. Keeping it timely, accurate and robust is vital to maintaining a lively relationship with members.

Any white elephant donations left at the end of the guild meeting will be donated to a local thrift shop.






























## Block of the Month— "Arabesque" Due at March's Guild Meeting, unfinished 15.5"

Special Note: These directions were taken from Moda's Bake Shop in a design created by Allison Jensen titled "Arabesque."

Supplies and Cutting	
Layer Cake	(1) 10in Square
Any color you want	
Background/Neutral	(1) 10in square
	(4) 4.25in square
	(2) 4.25in X 8in Rectangle

Put one of layer cake square right side together with a background square. Mark diagonal lines, as shown in black, and sew 1/4" along each side of both lines, as shown in white. Give them a good press after that to make cutting easier.



Cut along your marked lines, as well as half way (at the 5" mark) horizontally and vertically.



When you open them up you should have 8 half square triangles.

Trim your HSTs to 4.25" and stack them by print. I highly recommend a Bloc Loc ruler and rotating cutting mat for the trimming. It makes this step so much faster, and even a little bit fun :)
























## Block of the Month— Due at March's Guild Meeting

Begin to lay out your stars in this manner, with background rectangles on the upper left and lower right. As you lay them out the stars will interlock with one another. Be sure not to place any background rectangles vertically, or you won't be able to sew your rows together.
